Privacy policy: Traffic control in the waiting area for heavy traffic in Vaalimaa

The purposes for which your personal data is used and your rights as a data subject are described in this privacy policy. This privacy policy concerns traffic control at the Vaalimaa waiting area for heavy traffic, i.e. the lorry parking area. This includes registering the vehicle for queue upon arrival in the area, after which the vehicles are directed in turn from the waiting area through a customs check and out of the border control station. To this end, the Customs shall be notified of the queue order and transport priority of the vehicles due for customs checks.

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2 Purpose of personal data processing

Personal data is processed for the purposes of traffic control in the waiting area for heavy traffic in Vaalimaa.

3 Basis for the processing of personal data

The processing of personal data is based on section 4, subsection 1, paragraph 2 of the Data Protection Act in accordance with Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation (the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller), because the processing is proportionate and necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by an authority.

As the transport infrastructure manager, the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency is responsible for the road network on transport routes administered by the State, which also includes the waiting area for heavy traffic in Vaalimaa and the provision of traffic control services in the waiting area. Ensuring smooth traffic flow in the waiting area for heavy traffic and on the connected roads promotes the public interest.

The duties and competence of the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency aimed at promoting the public interest are based on the following legislation:

Act on the Finnish Transport Agency (862/2009), sections 1 and 2 in particular.

Act on Transport Services (320/2017), sections 136 and 137 in particular.

Highways Act (503/2005), sections 4 and 5 in particular.

4 Personal data to be processed

The Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency processes the following personal data:

- Driver's phone number
- Vehicle registration number
- Possible information on the high priority of transport
- Information stored in the system on the registration, such as time

5 Retention period of personal data

Personal data will be stored for the period of the traffic control process until the vehicle clears the customs check and exits the area. After this, the personal data will be deleted within one (1) hour at most.

6 Regular sources of data

The driver of the vehicle provides the data at the self-service point of the waiting area for heavy traffic upon arrival.

7 Recipients of personal data

The Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency uses its contracting partners as processors of personal data. Personal data is processed in the information systems of the Finnish

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Transport Infrastructure Agency or its contracting partners, and the suppliers of these information systems also act as the processors or sub-processors of the personal data. The Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency acquires the service from the traffic management company Fintraffic Ltd and its subsidiary Fintraffic Road Ltd. Fintraffic Road Ltd uses GoSwift Finland Ltd as the sub-processor of personal data in its service. GoSwift is responsible for the technical production and maintenance of the service.

To fulfil the purpose of the service, each vehicle's registration number and priority notification shall be reported to the Customs to inform the authorities of the order of processing and the priority of transport of the vehicles due for customs checks.

Moreover, data is disclosed to parties requesting it in accordance with the Act on the Openness of Government Activities. Official documents are public unless specifically covered by a confidentiality obligation by law. Personal data is not disclosed for direct marketing or for opinion and market research, unless there are separate provisions permitting disclosure for this purpose.

8 Data transfers outside the EU or EEA

Personal data is not transferred outside the European Union or the European Economic Area.

9 Rights of the data subject

You have the right to know whether we process personal data about you and the right to receive a copy of your personal data (Article 15 of the General Data Protection Regulation).

You have the right to ask us to rectify any incorrect details in your personal data (Article 16 of the General Data Protection Regulation).

Under Article 18 of the General Data Protection Regulation, you have the right to restrict the processing of your personal data when:

- you have informed the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency of incorrect personal data and the Agency is checking the matter;
- your data is being processed in an unlawful manner, but you do not want your data to be erased;
- the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency no longer needs the personal data in question, but you need it for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims; or you have objected to the processing of personal data pursuant to Article 21(1) pending the verification whether the legitimate grounds of the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency override yours.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data on the basis of a special personal situation when the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency is processing your personal data on the basis of Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection

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Regulation to perform a task promoting public interests or to exercise public authority belonging to the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency.

The Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency does not make decisions based on automated decision-making such as profiling.

You can submit a request concerning your rights to the Finnish Transport Infrastructure Agency by e-mail or by post. For contact information, see section 1.

The data and measures are free of charge for the data subjects, unless the requests are manifestly unfounded or unreasonable (especially if they are presented repeatedly).

You have the right to submit a complaint to the supervisory authority if you consider that the processing of your personal data violates the applicable data protection regulations. The Data Protection Ombudsman (Office of the Data Protection Ombudsman, www.tietosuoja.fi/en) acts as the supervisory authority in Finland.
